# Sturgeon Bycatch Mitigation Workshop

September 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> 2024

## Description:

Join us for a 1.5-day workshop in Bordeaux with sturgeon researchers, fisheries officials, fishers, and bycatch researchers. The workshop aims to:

- 1. Learn about global sturgeon bycatch mitigation efforts.
- 2. Share experiences and resources for awareness campaigns, tracking, and reporting.
- 3. Identify collaboration opportunities with bycatch mitigation for other protected species.

This workshop follows the 30-year celebration of the IUCN Sturgeon Specialist Group (SSG), which will review sturgeon conservation progress over the past three decades. The IUCN SSG meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> 2024 and is open to visitors. The IUCS SSG meeting is followed by the WSCS General Assembly on September 3<sup>rd</sup> from 17:00 to 19:00.
